**Puppy Dog**

**6-8mths (6,4)**

1. Parker and Martin's Olleyville Otherston Lad. Striking brindle and white boy. Balanced head with large expressive eyes. Good length of neck leading into well laid-back shoulders. Short back. Excellent bone. Movement slightly untidy but will strengthen with maturity.

2. Brown and Hutchings' Winuwuk Chance Encounter. Well grown brindle and white lad with excellent expression. Head correct for age and a very good mouth. Slightly longer cast than 1 with good angles fore and aft. Moved well for a baby.

**8-10mths (2,1)**

1. Kay's Seacrest Dodging Bullets. Strong brindle and white with good substance. Masculine head with good skull to muzzle ratio. Wide straight mouth with large teeth. Evident forechest, level topline and well angulated quarters. Moved ok. BSP.

**10-12mths (3)**

1. Mullis' Idleforde Cracker Jack. Medium sized, square brindle and white male. Typical head with alert expression. Arched neck, level topline, well angulated quarters. Moved with energy and enthusiasm. Very good temperament.

2. Downing's Stellvana One Direction. Red and white. Taller and longer cast than 1. Balanced head with good mouth. Firm level topline. Shown in excellent condition and well handled. Moved with drive.

**Junior Dog 12-15mths (4,1)**

1. Hyde's Stothard Pure Didly Dokely. Eyecatching brindle and white of correct size. Balanced head with a lovely expression. Good length of neck that flows into a short back giving a square outline. Good bone and angulation. Movement slightly loose but will tighten as he strengthens with maturity. Well handled.

2. Palmer's Palerty Psycho Mantis. Longer cast brindle and white. Head needs time to finish. Mouth good with decent sized teeth. Level topline, which he held on the move. Not quite the lay back of shoulder as 1. Excellent feet and pasterns. On his toes and enjoying himself.

**15-18mths (0)**

**Puppy Bitch**

**6-8mths (6,3)**

1. Brown and Hutchings' Winuwuk Brief Affair. Captivating brindle and white with the most beautiful head and expression. Correct skull to muzzle ratio, wide straight mouth and evident chin. Long arched neck, good lay back of shoulder, level topline that she held on the move. One to watch. BPB. Lost out to the dog for BP on maturity.

2. Beardsell and Van-Beck's Newlaithe Gingernut. Extrovert red and white girl. Pleasing, well balanced head with a mischievous expression. Good angles fore and aft, and firm level topline maintained on the move. Well handled.

**8-10mths (3,2)**

1. Holmes' Nias Little Angel. Square deer red and white girl. Would prefer head to be cleaner, but kind expressive eyes. Well defined wither, level topline. Well presented by her young handler.

**10-12mths (2)**

1. Watson and Crooks' Allerz Blackpearl At Roylark. Well grown dark brindle and white. Balanced head with straight mouth and evident chin. Long neck used to her advantage. Good temperament. Moved with purpose and drive.

2. Brooks' Jetboom Juicy Gossip About Jinnybrux. Brindle and white. Smaller type than 1. Clean head with good skull to muzzle ratio. Evident chin and good lip placement. Arched neck, well angulated quarters. Moved with drive and shown in gleaming condition.

**Junior Bitch 12-15mths (8,4)**

1. McCarthy and Gethin's Sunvalley Heart On Fire At Jeddhi. Brindle and white bitch who demands you look at her and on closer inspection doesn't disappoint. Beautiful clean balanced head. Dark mischievous eyes with a glint of wickedness. Wide straight mouth. Long flowing neck, well-constructed

shoulders, level topline and strong hammy quarters. Moved with purpose. Pleased to award her Best Junior and Best In Event. Top class. Will follow her career with interest.

2. Wilkinson's Rimru Northern Lass. My notes read love her! Brindle and white girl who is so well made. Feminine balanced head with a wide straight mouth. Slightly longer cast than 1. Correct balance of substance to elegance. Fabulous bone, correct angulation, free from any exaggeration. The more you look at her the better she is. If only she didn't give her handler such a hard time.

15-18mths (4,2)

1. Parker and Martin's Olleyville Peggy Olley. Brindle and white medium sized. Typical head with straight wide mouth and inquisitive eyes. Good length of neck, lay back of shoulder and strong well-muscled quarters. Extrovert temperament. Moved with drive.

2. Brown and Hutchings' Celia Cruz At Winuwuk. Striking deer red and white with the most beautiful balanced head that shouts boxer at you. Dark expressive eyes, good mouth and lip placement. Long arched neck, well defined withers. Well matched angles fore and aft. Slightly longer cast than 1. Sympathetically handled.
